Armon Johnson has all the physical tools you would want in a point guard. He has really good size standing at 6'3.25" and a terrific wingspan at 6'8". On top of that, he is very strong and one of the quicker players in the draft. Johnson also has a good feel for the game. He can make all the passes and is a solid ball handler.

There are a few question marks with Johnson. The first is; will he ever become a respectable perimeter shooter? Johnson shot just 24 percent from 3-point territory at Nevada. His mid-range game is also very inconsistent. Defensively, he gets beat off the dribble too many times for a player with his physical tools. All in all, Johnson is a very solid point guard prospect with good potential.
